Waste Management Update

Waste Management recently notified us they will be charging homeowners whose trash and recycling are not handled correctly. After a brief educational period, you may be charged \$5 when you overfill a trash cart or \$5 when you contaminate your recycling cart.

- All materials must fit in your carts, both the trash and recycling carts, and the lids must be fully closed.
- Materials must be placed in the right carts – never mix trash and recyclables.
- Recycle empty and dry bottles, cans, papers, and cardboard.
- Do not place food or liquid in the recycling cart.
- Recyclables should be placed separately in the cart; do not bag recyclables.
- Loose plastic bags are not recyclable.
- Leave caps on bottles to be recycled.
